

Caleb Smith grew up in Durham, NC. His favorite activities were soccer and video games. After high school, Caleb was given a phenomenal opportunity to play professional soccer in Germany.

While in Germany, Caleb started planning for a future career merging his passions. His goal was to combine the youth sports model that helped him develop as both an individual and team player with the world of competitive video gaming.

In October 2020, Caleb's dream opened as brick-and-mortar gaming center in Cary, NC. Between opening in a pandemic and little to no buyer awareness of Esports as an industry, Caleb had to learn quickly how to pivot in order to to lead the organization to success.

Caleb worked diligently to establish North
Carolina Esports Academy in the community.
He secured partnerships with local K-12 schools,
universities and nonprofits to bring Esports to
at-risk and underpriviledged youth.

In his spare time, Caleb coaches Men's and Women's Soccer at Woods Charter. He also serves on area school committees, and volunteers to assist students with elective projects.

What we are doing is completely unique. The model was created from scratch and we've ended up Revolutionizing Esports.

THOUSANDS OF IT JOBS ARE UNFULFILLED IN NC.

North Carolina Esports Academy is exposing young people to IT career paths they didn't know existed by providing gaming & STEM learning opportunities.

TECH IS CHANGING AT SUCH A RAPID PACE, OVERWORKED K-12 EDUCATORS & UNDERFUNDED SCHOOLS CAN'T KEEP UP.

North Carolina Esports Academy is based on educational tech. Our curriculum and equipment is constantly kept up to date. We utilize esports and work with the school system to expose young people to and get them comfortable with our near future of robots, drones, VR, simulators, blockchain, cyber security, and more.

Additionally, we host Spirit Night Giveback
Programs and give 50% back to
North Carolina elementary
and middle schools for any student who
attends spirit night.





THERE IS A MYTH THAT VIDEO GAMERS ARE ISOLATED, ANTI-SOCIAL, TOXIC, UNHEALTHY, AND UNPRODUCTIVE.

We make gaming social by providing a hands-on, in-person gaming experience. In addition to teaching tech skills, we put an emphasis on character, life skills building, health and wellness, and internet safety. Right outside the doors of our gaming center at Waverly Shopping Center, there is a playground that we make use of daily.



UNDERPRIVILEGED & AT-RISK YOUTH ARE UNABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN OUR PROGRAMS BECAUSE THEY LIVE TOO FAR AWAY FROM OUR GAMING CENTER.

We invested in more PCs and Gaming Laptops to take our programs into the community via our Mobile Services Program in April 2022. Since then, we've operated out of community centers and other venues to reach this population, provide them with a fun outlet, positive influence for personal growth, and exposure to STEM education opportunities they otherwise would not have experienced. We have served over 5,000 youth, 100 educators, and performed 27 educational mobile service events.

CHANGING LIVES

AND MAKING AN IMPACT

Not all young people will play a traditional sport or participate in an extracurricular activity. Extracurricular activities are extremely important for youth growth and development. Being part of a team gives youth a sense of belonging, teaches sportsmanship, teamwork, communication skills, accountability and strategy.

We've developed Esports TEAMS to provide this for young people. Our coaches have a fantastic technique to remove pre-existing rage and toxicity issues that are common in most sports. At North Carolina Esports Academy, we've created 7 Youth Teams and participated in three Youth Leagues.

As a field trip destination for nonprofits, schools, homeschool organizations, local rec centers, and YMCAs, we provide a virtual playground community to have fun, encourage personal growth, a passion for technology, and a desire to elevate our collective future.
